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## DECA NEWS

Nashoba DECA is back in business, literally! DECA members have been enthusiastically working on their 5, 11 and 30 page papers, as well as role plays, all in preparation for Nashoba's DECA Mock Competition. The competition took place on December 10th in the Nashoba Auditorium. The volunteer judges were community professionals in the business field. The event was a success for the DECAcated students of Nashoba with a fun twist in the competition for the Nashoba Best Buddies.



The day kicked off with students rushing to the business classroom before first period to greet their group and drop off their posters. For newcomers, this is where the angst set in. The daunting plan board boasted #RoadToNashville setting the bar high for nationals. The first wave of students headed down to compete around 8 am.

Each wave of presentations was given 10 minutes to prepare within their group. Note cards were flying, posters were flopping, and stress was through the roof. When the teams were ready to compete, they were called into the auditorium where they met their judge.

DECA teams presented in a one-on-one setting with a judge. They were given 10 minutes to present and another 20 minutes to chat about the project. Judges gave valuable feedback to the presenters. In addition to verbal constructive criticism, judges filed a feedback sheet with further suggestions in the group's folder. The stress of the presentation finally concluded after judges sent the students back to class.

When DECA members headed back to class, the Nashoba Best Buddies headed down to face their judges in their very first Best Buddies business competition. In the few weeks leading up to the competition, the Best Buddies had a blast preparing their presentations. They were prompted to create a roller coaster based on their favorite movie and favorite colors. After their coaster was drawn out and decorated, they created a presentation that described why their design plan was the best. On competition day, they present-

ed in a low-stress environment to the same judges that judged the DECA mock.

Each Best Buddy was paired with their peer buddy and other students from the Marketing and Community Partnership class. The roller coasters created by the Best Buddies were influenced by movies such as Batman, Star Wars, and Frozen. Each group won a prize unique to their roller coaster design. The whole day would not have been possible without the tireless effort by Mr. A, Mr. Murphy, Mrs. Foley, and all of the Best Buddies teachers.

The exciting day got the Nashoba DECA members ready to rumble for the District competition which will be held on Thursday, January 7th at the Radisson Hotel in Chelmsford and State DECA competitions, which will be in March. Though the business-filled day was formal, students and judges got to relax and enjoy the tremendous efforts of the Nashoba Best Buddies in the presentation of their roller coaster. ## **BOLTON REPAIR CAFÉ EVENT SATURDAY, JANUARY 23**

Do you have a lamp with a frayed cord or a bike with a broken brake? Maybe a shirt or blouse with a loose or missing button? Don't toss it! Bring it to the next Bolton Repair Café on Saturday, Jan 23, from 9 am to 1 pm. The event will be held at a new location, the cafeteria at the Florence Sawyer School, 100 Mechanic Street in Bolton. The school is located behind the Emerson School, which is on the same driveway/street. Residents of Bolton and surrounding towns are invited to come and find out what a Repair Café is all about.

At the Repair Café, sponsored by the Rotary Club of Nashoba Valley, everything centers on making repairs. Knowledgeable volunteers will help repair items such as mendable clothing, lamps, small appliances, computers and other electronics, bikes, toys, jewelry, and dull blades— free of charge. (Some small parts may be supplied, such as wire or thread; you will be asked to pay for other parts.) If you know what parts are needed, please get them ahead of time and bring them to the Repair Café to save time.

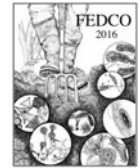
Volunteers at the Repair Café will look at all items brought in and try to repair them. If the volunteers cannot repair something, they will offer suggestions about where you could go for repairs.

Unlike a "fix-it" shop where people drop off items to be repaired and continue about their day, the Repair Café is meant to get people involved with the repair process and create connections with others in the community. People bringing in items for repair are asked to stay while your items are being fixed. You can just watch, help with the repair, fix the item yourself with help from volunteers, or just have a snack and visit with neighbors.

The Repair Café idea is catching on in the area. In addition to the Bolton events, the Stow Council on Aging, with help from the Rotary Club of Nashoba Valley, held an event in Stow in September. They are planning to hold their next event in April. The Westborough Public Library, together with the Rotary Club of Westborough, is planning to hold their first event in February or March.

The Bolton Repair Café is sponsored by the Rotary Club of Nashoba Valley with support from Bolton Local and the Repair Café Foundation. These events have been held in Bolton 3 times a year starting in September, 2013.

Anyone who lives in Bolton or neighboring towns is welcome to participate in this group order. A pick up date time will be set up once the seeds are available.

Orders can be placed on-line and you can start now by going to [www.fedcoseeds.com/seeds/](http://www.fedcoseeds.com/seeds/). Once you place your order on-line, when checking out, choose "Part of a group" as your shipping option. You will then need to enter the Group Name as Bolton Community Garden and the Group Order Number as 99002. Use your own address and phone number as the contact information so that we know who you are.

Payment is through us. Write a check payable to "Bolton Local" for the amount of your order less 10%. Make sure your check has your email address and a phone number so we can contact you when the order is received. Send the check to BCG, c/o David Velten, 67 Green Rd, Bolton, MA 01740. If you have questions, you can call Dave at 978-779-5422 . Note: **deadline for ordering is Sunday, February 7**. Please be sure we receive your check by Wednesday, February 10. The early order deadline is necessary so we have a good chance of receiving what we order. Some seeds are available in limited quantities and sell out early, so order your seeds now so you aren't disappointed.
