National Merit Scholarship Semifinalist and National Achievement Scholarship Program:

Nashoba is very proud to announce that Samantha Squires, Aaron Wassall, and Samantha Lindsay have been named as a National Merit Scholarship Semifinalists. This is quite an accomplishment for all of the students and one that can be shared with excitement by the entire school community. To grasp the magnitude of this distinction, it is important to evaluate the data. Merit Scholarship Semifinalists are in a group of 16,000 students nationwide who scored at the top of the PSAT's in their state and thus in the overall country. When one considers that over 1.5 million students take the PSAT, that sheds some light on this achievement. The list of Commended Students, or those who finished in the top 50,000 nationwide, will be forthcoming in the next month's newsletter as they have not been released yet.

In addition, Christopher Haid has been named a Semifinalist in the National Achievement Scholarship Program. He is one of only 1,600 students in the country, out of a pool of 160,000, to be considered a Semifinalist. The NMSC is a privately financed academic competition that operates without government assistance. It was formed in 1964 to provide scholarships and recognize academically talented black students throughout the nation.

We wish all of these students the best of luck as they pursue these outstanding opportunities.

Education Proficiency Plans:

Starting with the class of 2010, in order to achieve Competency Determination as defined by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, students who did not meet Proficient (scaled score of 240 or higher) on either ELA or Mathematics must fulfill the requirements of an Educational Proficiency Plan (EPP), which shall be developed for the subject area(s) in which students did not score at least 240. Though students may also meet these requirements through the MCAS performance appeals process, Nashoba has developed a procedure that will enable our students who earned Needs Improvement (less than 240 scaled score) on one or both of those above mentioned exams to achieve Competency Determination and thus a certified high school diploma. Essentially, the EPP must meet the following criteria:

- A review of the student's strengths and weaknesses based on MCAS and other assessment results, coursework, grades, and teacher input;
- The courses the student will be required to take and successfully complete in grades 11 and 12 in the relevant content area(s); and
- A description of the assessments the school will administer to the student annually to ensure he or she is making progress toward proficiency.

Any student who meets the above mentioned criteria will receive a personalized EPP that will be mailed directly to the student's home. Eagle Scout Project:


Senior Andrew Lincoln has commenced an Eagle Service Project on the grounds of Nashoba Regional High School. His project will be the development of a memorial garden

Teams of up to seven students choose their challenge and

work developing their solution. Volunteer team managers (parents, teachers or community volunteers) facilitate the group, but cannot give technical or other assistance. Kids are empowered to design, produce and present all of their own work. Teams present their solutions at regional and state tournaments, which demonstrate to teams that there are many ways to solve the same problem. High scoring teams may advance to the ultimate creativity showdown, Global Finals, held each May at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville.

Prevention & Treatment for H1N1 Virus: What can I do to protect myself from getting sick?

There is no vaccine available right now to protect against 2009 H1N1 virus. However, a 2009 H1N1 vaccine is currently in production and may be ready for the public in the fall. As always, a vaccine will be available to protect against seasonal influenza.

There are everyday actions that can help prevent the spread of germs that cause respiratory illnesses like influenza.

Take these everyday steps to protect your health:

- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water, especially after you cough or sneeze. Alcohol-based hand cleaners* are also effective.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Germs spread this way.
- Try to avoid close contact with sick people.



If you are sick with flu-like illness, CDC recommends that you stay home for at least 24 hours after your fever is gone except to get medical care or for other necessities. (Your fever should be gone without the use of a fever-reducing medicine.) Keep away from others as much as possible to keep from making others sick.

Other important actions that you can take are:

- Follow public health advice regarding school closures, avoiding crowds and other social distancing measures.
- Be prepared in case you get sick and need to stay home for a week or so; a supply of over-the-counter medicines, alcohol-based hand rubs,* tissues and other

related items might be useful and help avoid the need to make trips out in public while you are sick and contagious

What is the best way to keep from spreading the virus through coughing or sneezing?

If you are sick with flu-like illness, CDC recommends that you stay home for at least 24 hours after your fever is gone except to get medical care or for other necessities. (Your fever should be gone without the use of a fever-reducing medicine.)

Keep away from others as much as possible. Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when coughing or sneezing. Put your used tissue in the waste basket. Then, clean your hands, and do so every time you cough or sneeze.



**We will do our best to keep our school community informed of all new information as we receive it regarding the H1N1 virus. If your child is out sick with flu like symptoms, please call the nurse sick line and report that information.

PowerSchool Parent/Guardian Access School Year 2009-2010

We see communication among parents, students and teachers as a cornerstone to academic success. For the past seven years we have been using PowerSchool, a database for student information. PowerSchool is a web-based application used for state reporting, grade posting, report cards, attendance, student emergency contact information and other activities. We offer a feature of PowerSchool called Parent Access to the parents/guardians of our students. In grades 6-12, Parent Access includes access to grades, attendance, teacher comments, posted assignments, lunch balances and transactions. In grades below six, parents view lunch balances and transactions.

Internet access is needed to access the site. If you do not have access in your own home, the town library computers can be used and we can also make arrangements for you to use a school computer. We do have two requirements that must be satisfied before a parent or guardian is given access and a user name and password.
