## From the Principal's Desk



Dear Nashoba parents and students:

Shortly after the winter break, Nashoba Regional High School as well as the other schools in our district will be moving to a new and more secure security system. We will be installing magnetic door locks to our front doors which will require people to announce their intention to enter our building and then be buzzed in by a member of the office staff. Once school has begun, the front doors will be locked throughout the school day. Anyone entering the school to visit the nurse, guidance, athletics or the main office will be required to be buzzed in and then must sign in with the main office. Although this may be a bit of an annoyance at first, it is in the best interest of the safety of our students and faculty. As always all other doors will be locked by the administration once school begins. Students who arrive late must go to the front doors and request to be buzzed in. This new system in addition to outside cameras will allow the school to be even more secure.

Please be patient and understanding as we become more familiar with this system. In the end this will ensure that we have even better control of the traffic flow into our building.

#### **STANLEY KOPLIK CERTIFICATE OF MASTERY**

Students who are eligible to apply for the Stanley Koplik Certificate of Mastery based on their MCAS scores have until May 25, 2007 to turn in their application to guidance. The application requires two additional achievements (e.g., qualifying AP scores or qualifying SAT II scores). If all requirements are met, the student receives free tuition at any Massachusetts University or state college.

#### **PIROZZOLO FELLOWSHIP**

The Joan Woodruff Pirozzolo Fellowship is an opportunity for **juniors** who are interested in designing an independent student project. The award provides funds towards the project. Interested juniors should be thinking about projects that would benefit the school or community. Details about the application process will be available in guidance in January.

A recent recipient did a project on the importance of public health. She attended the national Youth Leadership Forum on Medicine in Georgia and then designed a presentation for the elementary school and high school to inform them about the risks of drinking and driving as well as a presentation on nutrition. Other examples of projects include: making a video documentary, painting murals, studying Shakespeare in England, scientific research or Civil War Research. The possibilities are unlimited!

#### **COLLEGE PLANNING FOR JUNIORS- FRESHMAN & SOPHOMORE PARENTS ARE WELCOME**

Paul Lynskey, Director of Secondary School Relations at the Massachusetts Educational Financing Authority

(MEFA), will make a presentation on the college search process and the admissions process. The presentation is scheduled for Tuesday, March 13 at 7:00 p.m. in the high school auditorium.

- What impacts the college admissions decision
- Questions to ask during a campus visit
- Developing an essay that will have an impact
- Competitive College admissions
- Early Preparation for the financial aid process

#### **HARVARD-SMITHSONIAN CENTER FOR ASTROPHYSICS**

Every summer the Harvard-Smithsonian Center for Astrophysics offers a paid summer internship for a student who has completed their junior year. The Center is located near Harvard Square in Cambridge within walking distance of the Porter Square commuter rail station. The internship would involve working on the TRACE mission (a small explorer satellite starting its sixth year of solar observations). The student selected will work with members of the TRACE team on the analysis of a specific solar event, create movies using local software, and assist in educational outreach.

Interested students should contact the Guidance Office. Strong computer skills and a strong science background are imperative as the project is physics based.

## December is National Drunk and Drugged Driving Prevention Month

### Quick Facts about Drunk and Drugged Driving

- In 2005, 16,885 people died in alcohol-related motor vehicle crashes, accounting for 39% of all traffic-related deaths in the United States (NHTSA 2006).
- A alcohol-related motor vehicle crash *kills someone every 31 minutes* and nonfatal injures someone every two minutes (NHTSA 2006).
- Drugs other than alcohol (e.g., marijuana and cocaine) are involved in about 18% of motor vehicle driver deaths. These other drugs are generally used



in combination with alcohol (Jones et al. 2003).

- Each year, alcohol-related crashes in the United States cost about \$51 billion (Blincoe et al. 2002).

Most drinking and driving episodes go undetected. In 2005, nearly 1.4 million drivers were arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol or narcotics (Department of Justice 2005). That's less than one percent of the 159 million self-reported episodes of alcohol-impaired driving among U.S. adults each year (Quinlan et al. 2005). **For more facts, see [CDC's impaired driving fact sheet](#).**

### \*\*Homeland Security Basic Emergency Recommendation Supply List



Recommended Items to Include in a Basic Emergency Supply Kit:

- ◆ Water, one gallon of water per person per day for at least three days, for drinking and sanitation
- ◆ Food, at least a three-day supply of non-perishable food
- ◆ Battery-powered or hand crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert and extra batteries for both
- ◆ Flashlight and extra batteries
- ◆ First aid kit
- ◆ Whistle to signal for help
- ◆ Dust mask, to help filter contaminated air and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place
- ◆ Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- ◆ Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- ◆ Can opener for food (if kit contains canned food)
- ◆ Local maps
