From the Principal's Desk



I am pleased to announce that NRHS students again have performed extremely well on the MCAS. Every student who took the Technology Engineering test passed (the current class of 2010 must pass one of the four Science MCAS offerings). In fact, Boston.com online has NRHS rated first in the state for the Technology Engineering test. In addition, over 90 percent of the current juniors received either Advanced or Proficient on the English Language Arts and Mathematics tests as well. Furthermore, our teachers are working diligently to identify students who performed at the Needs Improvement or Warning in the 8th grade to ensure that we have plans of success in place. Clearly, MCAS is just one of the many factors that determine student understanding of key concepts and ideas; nevertheless, it is a testament to our students and teachers and the support that they receive at home that we continue this impressive success on this state benchmark.

Child Find and Section 504

Nashoba Regional School District is required under Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act to conduct a child find of students who have a qualifying disability or who are suspected of having a qualifying disability that would make them eligible for accommodations and/or services as prescribed by Section 504 and determined appropriate by a "504" team at your child's school. Please contact Jeremy Roche, the Section 504 coordinator for your child's school, for more information.

Additionally, please note that 504 plans should only run for the school year and any plans that were written in June will be reviewed annually, with the student's current set of teachers. That plan will end in June. The 504 plan should include what the accommodations are, who is responsible for implementing them, and what indicators of success would suggest revising the accommodations over time.

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**Driving Tips for Teens:



- Always wear your seat belt--and make sure all passengers buckle up, too.
- Adjust your car's headrest to a height behind your head--not your neck--to minimize whiplash in case you're in an accident.
- Never try to fit more people in the car than you have seatbelts for them to use.
- Obey the speed limits. Going too fast gives you less time to stop or react. Excess speed is one of the main causes of teenage accidents.
- Don't run red lights.
- Use turn signals to indicate your intention to turn or to change lanes. Turn it on to give the cars behind you enough time to react before you take the action. Also, make sure the signal turns off after you've completed the action.
- When light turns green, make sure intersection clears before you go.
- Don't drive like you own the road; drive like you own the car.
- Make sure your windshield is clean. At sunrise and sunset, light reflecting off your dirty windshield can momentarily blind you from seeing what's going on.
- Make sure your car has gasoline in it. Don't ride around with the gauge on empty--who knows where you might get stranded.
- Don't drink and drive, and don't ride with anyone who has been drinking. Call parents or friends to take you home if you need a ride.



Nashoba Robotics



The Nashoba Robotics Team has begun preparing for its third year of participation in the US FIRST Robotics Competition. The team is growing each year with over 25 students signed up for the 2007-2008 season so far. This is a terrific opportunity for any student interested in engineering, science, computer programming, or problem solving who is ready to embark on the task of designing and building a robot that will sustain the rigors of competition.

FIRST (For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology) is a multinational organization that is dedicated to the advancement of science, math, and technology through creative and innovative methods. One of these methods is the FIRST Robotics Competition in which teams of high school students work to solve an engineering design problem with guidance from adult mentors. They then compete against other teams in a highly energized atmosphere that feels like a cross between a sporting event and a rock concert.

One of the team's goals for this year is continuing to build a robotics program that will sustain itself for future Nashoba students. This requires dedicated students and adult volunteers as well as generous sponsors. The total cost to compete each year is in the range of \$12-15,000. The last two years, NASA awarded us rookie grants of \$6,000 each year and the team raised the remaining funds. This year, we are no longer eligible for the grant from NASA and need to raise the full amount ourselves.

Learning Objectives

- Students will learn of the importance of trade and merchants in European history and see how the city guilds of the low countries were a match for the major monarchical powers of England and France.
- Students will learn about the development of the City of London from Roman trading post to modern financial capital.
- Students will gain a sense of life in court while viewing and touring the lavish palace and gardens of Versailles.

Day-by-Day Itinerary

DAY 1: OVERNIGHT FLIGHT Depart from the USA.

DAY 2: LONDON Your ACIS Tour Manager welcomes you to London, and soon you're out discovering the markets of Covent Garden and more.

DAY 3: LONDON Today, learn about London's majestic past and fast-paced present, brought to life by your professional guide. Visit **St. Paul's Cathedral**, **Big Ben** and the **Houses of Parliament**, viewing pomp and ceremony at the Changing of the Guard, if available. The afternoon is free to view the Crown Jewels, shop at Harrods or visit the fascinating replica of Shakespeare's Globe Theatre.

DAY 4: PARIS Behold the English countryside on your way to the English Channel, which you race under on the **Eurostar**. Arrive in Paris three hours later. In the afternoon you will have time to stroll along the Champs Elysées or the Grands Boulevards and take in the lights

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of Paris at night.

DAY 5: PARIS This morning relive the history of Paris with a local guide, from medieval pageantry at **Notre Dame** to the monuments of Napoleon's conquests. Your ACIS Walking Tour takes you through the **Louvre's** treasury of art. *Enjoy an optional Bouteille d'Or dinner with an illumination drive of Paris (\$79).*

DAY 6: PARIS This morning is free for Impressionist artwork at the Musée d'Orsay or the city's lively outdoor markets. This afternoon journey to Louis XIV's palace at **Versailles** to view its royal extravagance. Final free evening to say *au revoir* to Paris.

DAY 7: AMSTERDAM Today you visit one of Europe's richest medieval cities, **Bruges**. A landscape of canals and priceless art, the city's grand square is a sign of its prosperity built on the cloth trade. Then drive across the great Rhine River delta on the way to Amsterdam.

DAY 8: AMSTERDAM Tour the capital of a seventeenth century European superpower, from the tall mansions of powerful burghers to the honeycomb of lovely canals. ACIS also provides your entrance to the great **Rijksmuseum**. *This afternoon there is an optional excursion to Volendam. Drive out to Zaanse Schans to see working windmills, then on to the fishing village of Volendam (\$35).* In the evening enjoy a relaxing **canal ride** through the heart of Amsterdam.





Last year's FIRST Robotics Competition involved 1307 teams comprised of 32,500 high school students from 7 countries. There were 37 Regional competitions in Brazil, Canada, Israel and the U.S. and a Championship in Atlanta, Georgia. All competitions are webcast to be viewed by anyone around the world.
